Introduction

Circomedia recognizes that some applicants may not meet the standard entry requirements for their chosen degree programme but may have relevant prior experience and learning that demonstrates their ability to succeed in the programme. As an institution accredited by Bath Spa University, we follow BSU guidelines for Accreditation of Prior Experience and Learning (APEL) to ensure fair and consistent recognition of prior learning.

Criteria for APEL eligibility

To be eligible for APEL as an alternative entry requirement, applicants must demonstrate that their prior experience and learning is equivalent to the knowledge, skills, and understanding required for entry onto the degree programme for which they are applying. This may include:

- At least three years professional experience in a relevant field
- Training courses and qualifications
- Voluntary work in a relevant field
- Self-directed learning

APEL assessment Process

The APEL assessment process involves a rigorous evaluation of the evidence provided by the applicant to demonstrate their prior experience and learning. The process includes:

1. **Initial Review:** Students are required to submit a detailed portfolio of evidence that demonstrates their prior experience and learning. This is reviewed by the APEL co-ordinator to ensure that the evidence is relevant to the module or programme of study being applied for.
2. **Formal Assessment:** A panel of academic staff assess the evidence provided by the student and determine the level of credit that can be awarded. This may involve an interview and demonstration of practical skills by the student to discuss their prior experience and learning in more detail.
3. **Credit Award:** If the applicant is successful in their APEL application, they may be made an offer to join the programme. The amount of credit awarded will be based on the level of equivalence between their prior experience and learning, and the module or programme of study for which they are applying.

Guidelines

The following guidelines apply to APEL for the programmes at Circomedia:

- A maximum of 50% of the total credit for a programme of study can be awarded through APEL
- A minimum of 20 credits must be taken through standard study at Circomedia
- APEL cannot be used to replace core modules
- APEL credits must be relevant to the programme of study for which the applicant is applying.
